<b>Impactful messages:</b> Emphasize the profession's entrepreneurial foundation and diverse career paths.
<b>Teaching techniques:</b> Enhance student engagement with interactive learning, case studies, guest speakers, and gamification.
<b>Strategic partnerships:</b> Welcome employers into the classroom, collaborate with community colleges, and get involved with state CPA societies.
<b>Tailored support:</b> Identify at-risk accounting students and provide them with additional tutoring, resources, and support, including empathy.
<b>Diversity and inclusion:</b> Incorporate diverse perspectives in the classroom and consider taking unintended bias training.
<b>Licensure support:</b> Help students interested in becoming CPAs understand national licensing requirements and best practices for CPA Exam preparation.
<b>Pipeline Pledge:</b> Take the <u>Pipeline Pledge</u> to get involved in activities that will help influence and grow the talent pool.
